#### Electronic Visas (e-Visas) for Tourists from US, Canada, and Australia

Citizens of the United States, Canada, and Australia can now request an electronic visit visa (evisa) to travel to Brazil, without the need to visit a Brazilian embassy or consulate to obtain it. The e-visa requests must be submitted exclusively through a link to VFS Global.

The Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, announced that the 2024 season of the International Experience Canada (IEC) Program is now open, which will allow nearly 90,000 young people from IEC partner countries and territories to come to Canada and participate.

## Revised requirements to better protect international students

The Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, announced that starting January 1, 2024, the cost-of-living financial requirement for study permit applicants will be raised so that international students are financially prepared for life in Canada. Moving forward, this threshold will be adjusted each year when Statistics Canada updates the low-income cut-off.

## Canada opens global immigration processing center in Romania

Canada's Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, announced the launch of a new global operations center in Romania, located in the Canadian Embassy in Bucharest. The center will employ 20 new staff members, both from Canada and locally, and is the second such center outside of Canada, with the first one opening in the Philippines in March. The centers support IRCC's processing network, extend work hours across multiple time zones, and increase overall processing capacity for applicants.

# Australia tightens student visa rules, plans to halve migrant intake

Australia has announced visa rules for international students and low-skilled workers, which could reduce its migrant intake by half over the next two years. The changes include higher English language requirements for students and more thorough assessments for second visa applications, which will extend their stay.

The Australian government has released a policy roadmap containing eight key actions and over 25 new policy commitments and areas for future reform. The Migration strategy is expected to return migration back to near pre-pandemic levels by next financial year.

## Visa-free entry scheme expanded to six additional countries

China's Foreign Ministry has announced that citizens from France, Germany, Italy, Malaysia, the Netherlands, and Spain can now enter China without a visa for various purposes such as business, tourism, family visits, and transit. This visa-free entry is valid for up to 15 days and will be implemented for a minimum of one year.

The Chinese foreign ministry announced that it will cut visa fees by 25 percent for travelers from countries such as Japan, Mexico, the Philippines, Thailand and Viet Nam until 31 December 2024.

The new policy allows mainland residents to take international flights directly from Hong Kong International Airport without an entry permit through the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge.

Hungary will launch its new "golden visa" program earlier than expected, in January 2024 instead of September 2024. The program will offer residency bonds to foreign investors starting from €250,000, with a minimum stay requirement of one day per year.

# Initiative to facilitate travelling at Christmas

The Minister for Justice in Ireland is issuing a Travel Confirmation Notice to help Non-EU/EEA Nationals who need to renew their permission to stay in the country. This notice allows individuals to travel internationally during the Christmas and New Year period even if their Immigration Residence Permit card has recently expired, if they have submitted an application to renew their permission in advance.
