Immigration agency unveils guidelines for Digital Nomads entering Canada

The Canadian immigration authority has updated its guidelines about its Digital Nomad Visa Program. This program allows remote workers, whether employed by international companies, self-employed, or providing services to clients outside Canada, to work in Canada for up to six months with just visitor status. If they obtain a Canadian employer, they can also apply for a work permit.

USCIS Announces Strengthened Integrity Measures for H-1B Program

The USCIS announced a final rule to strengthen the integrity of and reduce the potential for fraud in the H-1B registration process, including by reducing the potential for gaming the registration

system and ensuring each beneficiary would have the same chance of being selected, regardless of the number of registrations submitted on their behalf.

USCIS issues final rule to adjust certain immigration and naturalization fees

The USCIS published a final rule to adjust certain immigration and naturalization benefit request fees for the first time since 2016. The final rule will allow USCIS to recover a greater share of its operating costs and support more timely processing of new applications.

Australia

ImmiAccount security enhancements

Starting from 31 January 2024, all new and current users of ImmiAccount are required to verify their email address. Current users who have not yet verified their email address must do so the next time they log in. Meanwhile, new users must verify their email address upon creating an ImmiAccount. It is essential that users ensure their email address adheres to the security requirements.

Indonesia

Indonesia facilitates Golden Visa requirements for new capital investors

Internationals investing in Indonesia's new capital project, Nusantara (IKN), will be eligible to acquire residency in this country more easily through the Golden Visa Program. Requirements for foreign companies wishing to invest in IKN have been lowered from a minimum investment of US\$25 million to US\$5 million for a stay of 5 years. For a stay of 10 years, it has been lowered from US\$50 million to US\$10 million.

Iran eases entry rules for 28 countries

An Iranian government has announced that starting from 5 February 2024, nationals from 28 countries who intend to explore Iran as tourists will be allowed visa-free entry.

Kazakhstan releases Quota for Foreign Workers

The Kazakhstani government announced the foreign worker quotas (2024) for all work categories and regions.

Japan

Japan introduces Digital Nomad visas for 49 countries

Japan's Immigration Services Agency (ISA) has confirmed that the country will offer six-month visas to digital nomads who earn US\$68,300 or more. The program will permit citizens from a total of 49 countries to stay in Japan under the "specified activities" visa category.

New Zealand

Pinoys can apply for working holiday visas from March 2024

New Zealand has announced that it will start accepting applications for its working holiday visa program for Filipinos starting from 12 March 2024. This visa program allows individuals aged 18 to 30 to travel, study, and work temporarily in New Zealand. The program has a quota of 100 visas per cycle, and the application process usually takes around eight weeks, or until the quota is filled.

United Arab Emirates

United Arab Emirates announces visa-free travel for Armenian citizens

UAE announced a visa-free policy for citizens of the Republic of Armenia, which will take effect from 1 February 2024. Travelers are advised to ensure that their passports remain valid for at least six months from arrival. The visa waiver offers flexibility with a maximum stay of 90 days within 180 days.

Bulgaria

Bulgaria names street 'Nomad Place' to attract more Digital Nomads

The Ministry of Tourism and the municipality of Belia in Bulgaria have officially designated a street in Semkovo as "Nomad Place." This street is named after Coliving Semkovo, a residence for digital nomads situated at "Nomad Place 1."

Germany's Deutschlandticket price will remain EUR49

The German authorities have confirmed that the price of the Deutschlandticket will remain unchanged throughout 2024.

New Migrant Pathway: Specialist Employee Initiative

The Maltese government has introduced the Specialist Employee Initiative for third-country nationals applying for a work permit in Malta, alongside the Ordinary Single Work Permit and the Key Employee Initiative. This initiative aims to streamline the application process for different levels of specialization and remuneration.

Poland suspends work visa programme

Poland has decided to suspend the Business Habor Programme that was created with the aim of attracting foreign IT specialists to the country.

Immigration concession extended

The South African Department of Home Affairs is facing challenges with visa application backlogs, and the Minister has approved a temporary extension for affected foreign nationals until 30 June 2024, to address the issue.

Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) scheme expanded to include Gulf and Jordanian nationals

The UK has expanded its ETA scheme to include nationals from GCC countries and Jordan. The ETA replaces electronic visa waivers and will apply to all foreigners who don't need a visa to enter the UK by the end of the year.

United Kingdom & Japan will issue more visas under young mobility scheme

The UK and Japan have decided to expand their youth mobility schemes, according to the British Embassy in Tokyo. From 31 January 2024, the number of eligible Japanese nationals for the Youth Mobility Scheme will increase to 6,000. Similarly, starting from 1 April 2024, the number of eligible British nationals for the Working Holiday Scheme in Japan will also rise to 6,000.
