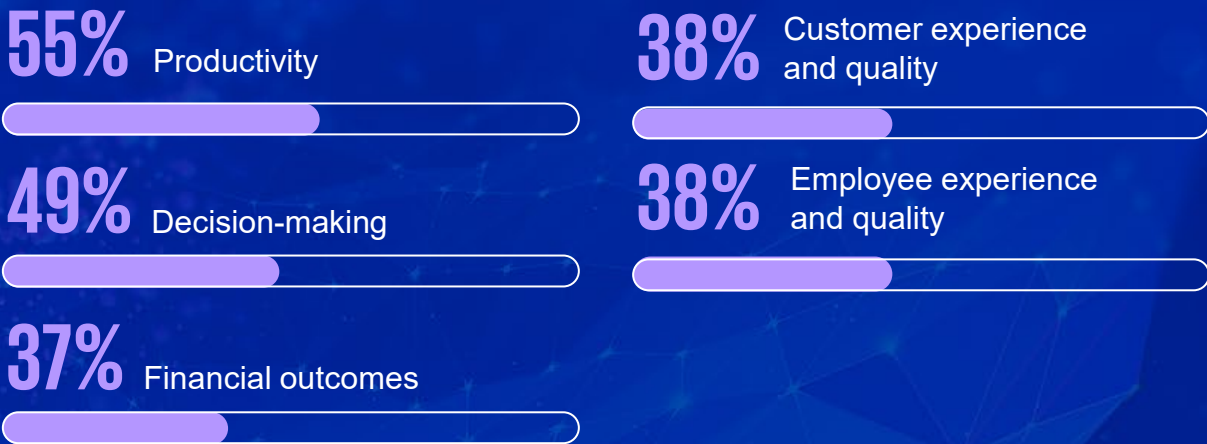


CEOs are actively owning AI as a strategic business priority, with clear accountability for AI-related outcomes across the organization:

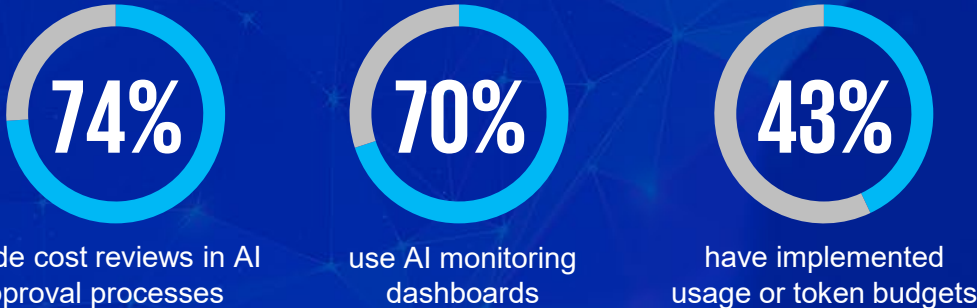

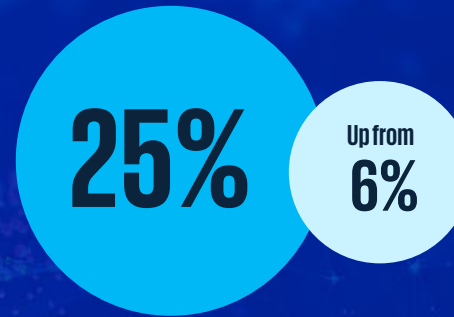
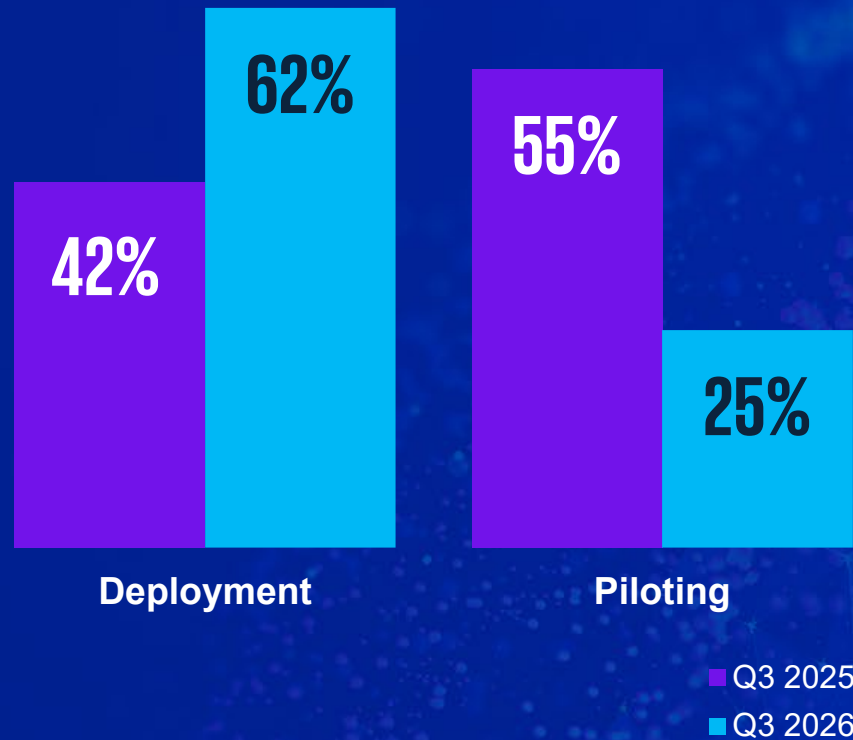


As AI moves deeper into day-to-day operations, organizations are also becoming more disciplined in how they manage AI usage.

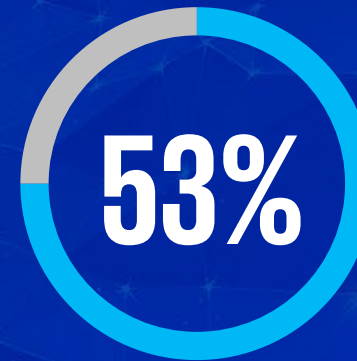


AI agent deployment and trends

AI agents are **increasingly** moving out of the pilot phase and into the enterprise.
Multi-agent deployment is **up four-fold**.



Those actively developing or implementing multi-agent systems climbed to 25%, compared to only 6% last quarter.



Data readiness and access is the top barrier to AI agent deployment.

Workforce

Organizations are formalizing how employees work with AI agents. Efforts to create guidelines, protocols, and AI collaboration skills among employee populations are up sharply.

Developing role-specific guidelines for effective AI agent collaboration and delegation is up year-over-year.

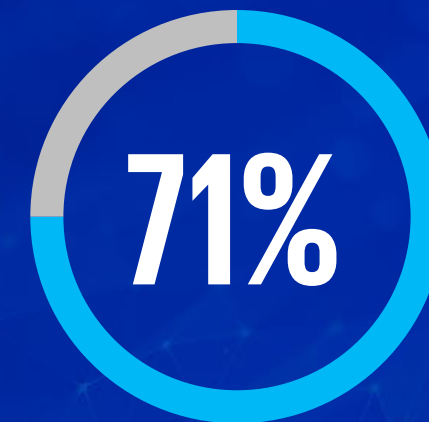

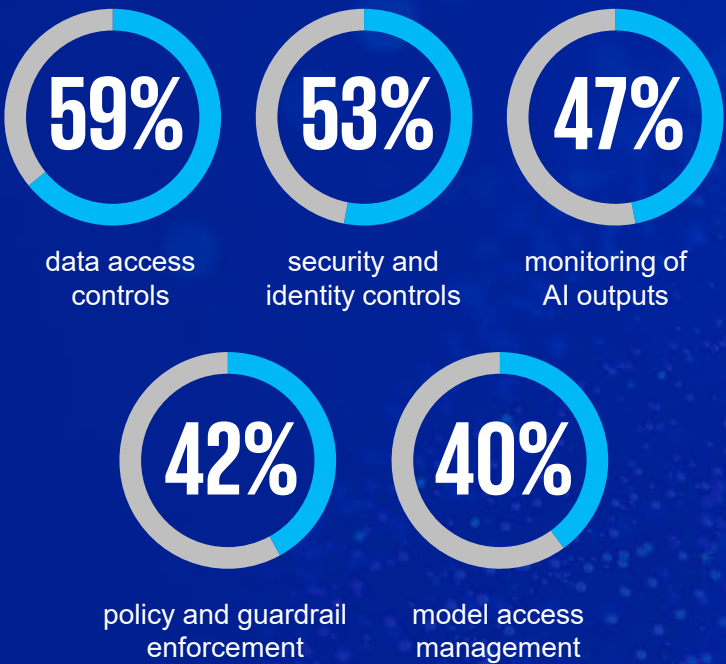

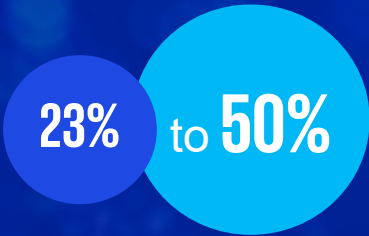
Governance and data

As AI agents scale, organizations are drawing sharper lines around autonomy, focusing on trusted data and clearer boundaries for autonomous decisions.

What's included in organizations' AI harness layer:



Half are establishing clear protocols for when and how to use AI agents, up year-over-year.



73% agree their organization has the capabilities and governance to manage AI risks at scale, up from 57% last quarter.

Organizations are anticipating increasing their data & analytics budgets in the next 12 months:



Organizations looking at AI agents as augmented support for employees and providing training to our workforce is up since Q3 last year.
