O'Donnell resigns as acting IRS Commissioner; Krause to serve until nominee is confirmed

The IRS yesterday announced that Melanie Krause will become the acting IRS Commissioner following Doug O'Donnell's retirement. O'Donnell, who has served as acting Commissioner since January, will retire on February 28, 2025. Krause, currently the IRS Chief Operating Officer, will move into the deputy Commissioner role and serve as the acting Commissioner of the IRS. Read the [IRS release](#) (February 25, 2025)
